## **EDITORIAL**

Incidentally, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's birth anniversary, 31st October, observed as National Unity Day or Rashtriya Ekta Diwas falls during the VAW celebrations. Sardar Patel, a founding father of the Republic of India and the first Deputy Prime Minister of India, played a leading role in integrating the independent provinces into a unified India. He was tall leader, who exemplified strong values and high integrity.

# Tête-à-tête with VP [Vigilance] & SA to CVO

Jayanta Kumar Basu VP [Vigilance] & SA to CVO

1. Close on the heels of your transfer to the Vigilance Department as VP [Vigilance] & SA to CVO, you had to drive the Vigilance Awareness Week (VAW) programs. This year we saw new initiatives. Please tell us about your experience.

As a newcomer in the Vigilance department, it was a highly challenging task for me to organise all the activities during VAW 2019, but at the same time it was a thrilling job also to work in a new environment and with the new team. At the end, it was obviously a very highly satisfying

experience for me, as I was able to introduce some new programs like Walkathon, Human Chain etc., which got a good response across all the sections of the Company.

#### 2. What is your vision for the Vigilance Department?

I have noticed that people generally avoid mixing or talking to employees in the Vigilance department. So, my first objective is to ensure that:

Vigilance Department is seen as a friendly and a positive department in initiating and promoting an
ethical and corruption-free work place in the organization

#### I would also like to:

- Make the employees / citizens aware of their rights to live in a corruption free society and to uplift the employees / citizens to discharge their duties for making a corruption free world

- Give more emphasis on preventive and participative activities, rather than post facto activities.
- 3. Prior to your heading the Vigilance Department, you were associated with the business. Today, you are spearheading a corporate function that promotes good governance. How does it feel to shoulder this new responsibility?

As Tagore wrote: "Bipode more Rokkha koro, e nohe mor prarthona, bipode ami na jeno kori bhoy." ("Save me from all odds is not my prayer, that may I have the courage to face any event")

If you replace the word "bipod" with "new responsibility", you will get my answer. I have faced many challenges in the past without fear and delivered results. I believe that, I will be able to face this new challenge with my new team and will certainly deliver the desired result.

4. We pride on Balmer Lawrie being a transparent and corruption free Company. What would be your message for every employee with respect to this?

I would like to start with a quote from Mr. Warren Buffett, "In an organisation we look for three qualities – integrity, intelligence and energy. If you do not have the first one, other two will kill you and your organisation."

We are celebrating the 154<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Company and we will celebrate many more in the coming years. It indicates that this Company is having very high integrity and ethical values, because of which it survived so long.

I came from Leather Chemicals Division and we used to promote the ethical value of the Company to our stakeholders. They believe that they will never get cheated by Balmer Lawrie. ## **EMPLOYEES SPEAK**

You have been a key member in organising the Vigilance Awareness Week programs at Balmer Lawrie. Tell us about your experience and how it felt to generate awareness not only amongst our colleagues but also students and others through the outreach programs.


# **AWARDS & ACCOLADES**


